Introduction

The Mystery of Paul's Apparently Contradictory Statements

- Previous Assertion: "I did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God's mystery." (1:1)

- Current Assertion: "However, we speak wisdom among those who are mature." (2:6)

Question Raised: What is the difference between these two types of wisdom? How can one obtain the latter wisdom?

1) The Wisdom That Paul and His Companions Proclaim — God's Mystery Appointed from the Very Beginning Scripture Passage: 1 Corinthians 2:6–9

- Who Are "Those Who Are Mature"?

- Not merely spiritual veterans, but those who have been saved
- Those who can receive "the word of the cross" as God's power

- Characteristics of God's Wisdom (v.7):

- 1. The wisdom of God, which was hidden as a mystery
- 2. Appointed before the world began

- The True Identity of God's Wisdom:

- Christ Himself (cf. 1:24)
- Righteousness, sanctification, and redemption in Christ (cf. 1:30)
- In other words, "salvation through Christ"

- The Ignorance of the Rulers of This Age (vv.8-9):

- They did not understand God's wisdom, and thus crucified the glorious Lord
- Because God's plan of salvation surpassed human imagination

Point 1: God's salvation is given from outside the bounds of human understanding.

2) The Revelation of Wisdom by the Spirit — Only the Spirit Knows the Things of God Scripture Passage: 1 Corinthians 2:10–11

- How to Know True Wisdom:

- It is revealed by the Spirit (v.10)
- The Spirit searches all things

- Just as "no one knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him," so also "no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God." (v.11)

Point 2: The things of God cannot be known apart from the Holy Spirit's revelation.

Practical Application:

- Even Bible study has its limits without the work of the Holy Spirit.
- When reading Scripture, we must pray for the Spirit's guidance.

3) The Way to Speak God's Wisdom — Having Received the Spirit, Speak in Words Taught by the Spirit Scripture Passage: 1 Corinthians 2:12–13

- Understanding as a Gift (v.12):

- We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit from God
- We understand the things freely given by God

- Principle of Speaking (v.13):

- Not in words taught by human wisdom
- But in words taught by the Spirit
- Explaining spiritual things with spiritual words

Point 3: When testifying or teaching Scripture, it is paramount to first rely on the Holy Spirit.

- Encouragement for Family Worship:

- For passing on faith and faith education
- To teach God's plan to one's family, the Spirit's guidance is indispensable

4) Characteristics of the Natural Man — Unspiritual, Cannot Understand the Words

of the Spirit Scripture Passage: 1 Corinthians 2:14–16 (first half)

- Condition of the Natural Man (v.14):

- Does not accept the things of the Spirit of God
- Considers them foolishness and cannot understand them
- Spiritual things are judged by the Spirit

- Characteristics of the Man Who Has Received the Spirit (v.15):

- He discerns all things
- Yet he himself is not judged by anyone

Practical Insight:

- Choosing to suffer loss for the Lord may look foolish to the world.
- The value of worship and service cannot be understood without the Spirit's leading.
- It is natural that the world will not understand.

Point 4: Belonging to the Spirit is judged by the Spirit.

Conclusion "We Have the Mind of Christ" (2:16, latter half)

- Privileges Given:

- 1. The mind of Christ = the Holy Spirit = God's wisdom
- 2. A great gift not given to the natural man
- 3. The Triune God's work is at work within us

Invitation to Respond:

- 1. Give thanks for this great gift.
- 2. Walk relying on the Holy Spirit.
- 3. Through the Holy Spirit, know, worship, and obey the Lord more.
- 4. Continue to proclaim the gospel of Christ and the truth of Scripture by the Spirit.
